Certificate in First Nations Language Proficiency Programs 2018 – 2019

The Yukon Native Language Centre (YNLC) - Council of Yukon First Nations (CYFN) and Simon Fraser University (SFU) are offering the following Fall 2018 courses at the Centre. Please check mark the box indicating the FNLN Course you are registering for:

- FNLG 133 Introduction to First Nations Language I (3 credits)**
Introduces the structure of a First Nations language, including phonetics, vocabulary, word formation, and grammatical constructions. Based on a designated language and usually chosen from the Northwest coast area. Students may retake this course for credit with focus on a different FN language. Students who have credit for FNLG 231 may not take this course for further credit.

Final Assessments: 9:00 a.m. to 4:00 p.m. - Dec 10,11, 12
- FNLG 130 Practical Phonetics for First Nations Languages (3 credits)**
Practical training in the description of sounds used in language. Students with credit for LING 130 may not complete this course for further credit. Prereq: FNLG 231 (or LING 231) before FNLG 130.

Final Assessments: 9:00 a.m. to 4:00 p.m. - Dec 10, 11, 12
- * FNLG 433 First Nations Language Mentoring I (3 credits)**
Intended for advanced learners of a particular First Nations language, however beginners may prefer this method of learning. Offers advanced vocabulary and/or grammatical skills through individualized practice with fluent speakers (usually elders) of that language. Students will be evaluated on the basis of the individualized goals and objects set at the beginning of the course. Students who have completed LING 433 for a designated language may not complete this course for further credit for the same designated language. Prereq: FNLG 332 (or LING 332) or permission of course supervisor.
Orientation & Training - 9:00 a.m. to 4:00 p.m. - Sept 20, 21, 22
Final Assessments: Dec 10, 11, 12, 13, 14 – 1 to 2 hour oral interview
- * FNLG 434 First Nations Language Mentoring I (3 credits)**
Offers additional advanced vocabulary and/or grammatical skills in the First Nations language through individualized practice with fluent speakers (usually elders) of that language. Prerequisite: FNLG 433(or LING 433) or permission of course supervisor. Recommended: FNLG 431 and 432. Students who have completed LING 434 for a designated language may not complete this course for further credit for the same designated language
Orientation & Training - 9:00 a.m. to 4:00 p.m. - Sept 20, 21, 22
Final Assessments: Dec 10, 11, 12, 13, 14 – 1 to 2 hour oral interview

**Note: If you have not reached an Intermediate level of speaking your language, you may take the FNLG 433 and 434 courses more than once, but with more advanced language content.*

**FNLG 433 AND * FNLG 434 (Mentor Apprentice courses) require you to have a fluent speaker to work with.*
